




Pennsylvania Firearms Rights & Disability Quicksheet

Avenues of Relief From Firearm Disabilities:

* **Relief May Be Available Via Petition to Court of Common Pleas:** Relief from a conviction or mental health disability may be available in Pennsylvania regardless as what state the disability arises from. Common Pleas relief is not available if you were convicted of any Felony, Misdemeanor 1 or any other crime punishable by more than 2 years of incarceration. Contact on Attorney to seek relief.

† **Pardon Relief May be Available:** Relief from a **Pennsylvania conviction** may be obtained via pardon from the governor's office via application available on governor's website or may be filed by an attorney of your behalf. Generally one will want to wait at least 5 years since the last conviction to apply for a pardon. Pardon's are all the sole discretion of the governor. If your conviction is from a state other than Pennsylvania, you must seek relief in that state.
